Topics discussed included: Mr. Robinson and Mr. Javis attended the Senate subcommittee meeting; defining a mobile barber shop; mobile barber shops must be connected to a brick-and-mortar shop; physical proximity of a mobile shop to another shop; affixing the shop license number to the outside of the mobile shop; mobile shop licenses should be renewed biannually, not annually; requiring contact information for the mobile shop and monthly schedules for the shop locations; and possibly having a separate manager for the mobile shop.

Ms. League will incorporate discussed suggestions to the language draft. She stated that the language discussed by the Task Force is not a position by the Board. These are just suggestions for the Senate subcommittee to consider. The suggestions will be sent to the Task Force and to the Board to determine whether an additional special called meeting would need to occur.
