### 2021 BUILDING CODE MODIFICATION REQUEST FORM

- Sufficient test information, studies, data, or other documentation that would be necessary to fully explain and justify the proposed amendment
- For local modification requests only: the physical or climatological basis for the request and the reason that the suggested change would correct the condition.
- A local jurisdiction or professional association shall not propose a modification which will amend, suspend, eliminate or supersede an existing statute, policy, rule or regulation of any state or federal agency per S.C. Regulation 8-240 (H).
- A completed modification request must be received with all required documentation before it will be reviewed.

202 General Definitions

Modification #1 -- modification to definition of 'drinking fountain'

DRINKING FOUNTAIN. A plumbing fixture that is connected to the potable water distribution system and the drainage system. The fixture allows the user to obtain a drink directly from a stream of flowing water without the use of any accessories. ((Such fixtures can be separate from or integral to a bottle filling station.))

Modification #2 -- new definition for 'bottle filling station'

((BOTTLE FILLING STATION. A type of water dispenser that is connected to the potable water distribution system and the drainage system. The fixture is designed and intended for automatically or manually filling personal use drinking water bottles or containers not less than 10 inches (254 mm) in height and is in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq.). Such fixtures can be separate from or integral to a drinking fountain and can incorporate a water filter and a cooling system for chilling the drinking water.))

Modification #3 -- modification to definition of 'water cooler'

WATER COOLER. A drinking fountain ((or bottle filling station)) that incorporates a means of reducing the temperature of the water supplied to it from the potable water distribution system.

Modification #4 -- modification to definition of 'water dispenser'

WATER DISPENSER. A plumbing fixture that is ((automatic or)) manually controlled by the user for the purpose of dispensing potable drinking water into a receptacle such as a cup, glass or bottle. Such fixture is connected to the potable water distribution system of the premises. ((This definition includes a freestanding apparatus for the same purpose that is not connected to the potable water distribution system and that is supplied with potable water from a container, bottle or reservoir.))

9/28 Study Committee Recommendation: Support approval

In 200 characters or less, please briefly describe the justification for this modification request.

Defines modern plumbing fixtures for sanitary drinking water access to the public. There is less frequent manual contact with water bottle filling stations versus drinking fountains. Filling stations allow for transportable water, encourage water consumption, and are more sanitary than drinking fountains. Bottle filling stations quickly and efficiently dispense water into receptacle. UPC recognizes bottle filling station and integrated function of drinking fountain. Bottle filling station included in UPC because 1) more hygienic, 2) saves up to 50% of wastewater generated as compared to drinking fountain, 3) reflects market trends.

The CDC now encourages staff and students to bring their own water to minimize use and touching of water fountains. This necessitates updates to the plumbing code in educational settings to allow for easy access to drinking water throughout the day for hydration needs. One study found that drinking fountains and manual pencil sharpener handles had more germs than any other surface in the classroom. Adequate water intake can positively impact children's cognitive performance, particularly short-term memory. Drinking water can also improve children's visual attention and fine motor skills.

In other occupancies where drinking fountains are required, water dispensers shall be permitted to be substituted for not more than 50 percent of the required number of drinking fountains. ((In educational settings, 50% of the required number of drinking fountains must incorporate a bottle filling station.))

touching of drinking fountains. Bottle filling stations increase access to clean, safe drinking
water. This necessitates updates to the plumbing code in educational settings to allow for
easy access to drinking water throughout the day for hydration needs. Modification specifies
bottle filling station must be substituted or incorporated into at least 50% of required drinking
fountains in educational settings.
