Boiler Safety Task Force Meeting
June 1, 2021

Meeting Called to Order

Committee Chairman Lee Richardson Jr. called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. Other persons attending the meeting included: Lewis Caswell, Board Member; Ron Spiker, Chief Boiler Inspector; Molly Price, Board Administrator and Georgia Lewis, Advice Counsel.

Public Notice

Public notice of this meeting was properly posted at the Synergy Business Park, Kingstree Building and on the Agency's website, and provided to all requesting persons, organizations and news media in accordance with Section 30-4-80 of the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act.

Administrator's Remarks

Ms. Price stated that the task force was appointed by the Board at their last meeting on January 21, 2021, to review and recommend changes to the Board's regulations related to which license classifications can perform boiler work. She thanked the task force members for their feedback with the regulation draft that was sent to them on April 20, 2021, and explained that the reason for the meeting today was to discuss the feedback that she received before taking the recommendation to the full Board in July.

Task Force Review of Licensure Requirements for Boiler Installation

Ms. Lewis provided the task force members with draft 2 of the proposed regulation she prepared after the last task force meeting and asked for additional input related to section 1 of the document.

Motion

Mr. Richardson made a motion that draft 2 from May 11, 2021, of the proposed regulation be modified where item 1 would refer to boilers that are fired with oil, gas, or electricity and have a steam or boiler pressure operating at pressures not exceeding 15 psig or a hot water boilers operating at pressures not exceeding 160 psig or temperatures exceeding 250 degrees Fahrenheit and that item 2 remain as written.

Mr. Caswell seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Caswell noted that he would like to look at the new draft once the changes are made, to make sure it is clear that both temperature and psig apply, and not just the "or" part of the statement.

Adjournment

Mr. Richardson made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Caswell seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

The task force adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
