# WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER:

# **COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS – Daniel Lehman**

### **ADMINISTRATOR'S REMARKS – Molly Price**

Mrs. Price stated that the committee was appointed by the Board on October 21, 2021, with the purpose of working with industry representatives from the South Carolina Electronic Security & Technology Association to review the South Carolina Alarm System Business Act, Chapter 79, for potential updates and changes. She reminded the committee members of where they left off at the previous meeting on November 10, 2022, and stated that the purpose of the meeting today was to continue identifying items that needed additional discussion and to then take those items and committee recommendations back to the Association and Contractor's Licensing Board for review.

### **REVIEW OF ALARM SYSTEM BUSINESS ACT**

The committee reviewed Chapter 79, South Carolina Alarm System Business Act, and focused most of their time discussing the application, examination and training requirements to become licensed in SC. The committee felt that some of the requirements in SC did not match other programs around the country and that it would be beneficial to continue researching the need for required training for qualified parties and some of the application processes and requirements.

The committee plans to start drafting recommended changes to take back to the Board and the Association for review and input.
