**1. Meeting Called to Order**

### A. Inspection Report – Matalie Mickens

Ms. Mickens informed the Board that she and Mr. Poole conducted 196 inspections between February 15, 2021, and June 9, 2021.

### B. Investigative Review Committee (IRC) Report

Mr. Rodney Pigford presented the April 20, 2021 IRC recommendations to the Board, which are to dismiss cases 2020-76, 2020-77, 2020-101, 2021-1, 2021-2, 2021-5, 2021-6, 2021-7, and 2021-9; file formal complaints for cases 2020-94, 2020-95, 2020-99, and 2020-100.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

### C. Office of Investigations and Enforcement (OIE) Report

The Respondent was present with his attorney, John M. Ervin, III. Mr. Donnell Jennings

represented the State and presented the Hearing Officer's Recommendation. Attorney Ervin addressed the Board and concurred with the Hearing Officer's Recommendation.

Mr. Landis Price, II recused himself. The Respondent was present with her attorney, Robert Coble. Mr. Donnell Jennings represented the State and presented the Hearing Officer's Recommendation. Attorney Coble addressed the Board and concurred with the Hearing Officer's Recommendation.

Mr. Baxter made a motion to accept the Hearing Officer's Recommendation. Mr. Gray seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Price returned to the meeting.

**11. Funeral Director and/or Embalmer**

These proceedings were recorded by a court reporter in order to produce a verbatim transcript should one be necessary.

**A. Funeral Director and/or Embalmer Application**

1. Ebonic Brown

Ms. Ebonic Brown appeared before the Board on her own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Ms. Brown is asking the Board to reinstate her South Carolina Funeral Director and Embalmer's license.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that Ms. Brown initially licensed in Texas in April 2008 as a Funeral Director and Embalmer. Thereafter, she licensed by endorsement/reciprocity in South Carolina on May 5, 2011 as a Funeral Director and Embalmer. Ms. Brown's South Carolina Funeral Director and Embalmer's license expired on June 30, 2014.

Ms. Brown addressed the Board and stated that in 2014 she was unable to obtain employment in the field so she sought other means of employment, including teaching in the school system, to support her family. Ms. Brown informed the Board that she currently has an opportunity to work at a funeral establishment and would like to be able to pursue her career in funeral service.

Ms. Brown informed the Board that she worked in the funeral service industry for four years under her Texas license.

Ms. Cooper joined the meeting at 10:55 a.m. The Board questioned Ms. Brown regarding this matter.

## **Executive Session**

### **MOTION**

Mr. Price made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Mr. Horton seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **Return to Public Session**

### **MOTION**

Mr. Price made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

### **MOTION**

Mr. Nelson made a motion that the Board approves the reinstatement of Ms. Brown's Funeral Director and Embalmer's license pending that she takes and pass the South Carolina State Funeral Board's law exam. Mr. Price seconded the motion. Mr. Price, Mr. Baxter, Dr. DuPre, Mr. Evans, Mr. Gray, Mr. Hodge, Mr. Horton, and Mr. Nelson voted in favor. Ms. Cooper abstained.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion to recess for 10 minutes.

### **MOTION**

Mr. Gray made a motion that the Board recess for 10 minutes. Mr. Price seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

### **MOTION**

Mr. Nelson made a motion the Board return to session. Mr. Gray seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **2. Kimberley Crowder Wyatt**

Ms. Kimberley Crowder Wyatt appeared before the Board on her own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Ms. Wyatt is asking that the Board grants her permission to license as an Embalmer. Ms. Holleman informed the Board that Ms. Wyatt initially appeared before the Board on December 19, 2019.

The Board conditionally accepted Ms. Wyatt's embalmer's apprenticeship pending that she passed the National Board Science exam by February 1, 2021 and if she failed to pass the exam within the allotted time, she would need to reappear before the Board. Ms. Wyatt passed the exam on May 19, 2021.

The Board questioned Ms. Wyatt regarding this matter.

### **MOTION**

Mr. Horton made a motion that the Board grants Ms. Kimberley Crowder Wyatt her Embalmer's license. Dr. DuPre seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **3. Joseph Giordano, Jr.**

Mr. Joseph Giordano, Jr. appeared before the Board on his own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Mr. Giordano is asking

that the Board approve his Funeral Director's application. Ms. Holleman informed the Board that Mr. Giordano initially licensed in New York on September 26, 1979 as a Funeral Director and Embalmer and does not have a criminal background. On June 27, 2003 he licensed by endorsement/reciprocity as a South Carolina Funeral Director and Embalmer. Thereafter, he cancelled his South Carolina Funeral Director's license effective on January 11, 2008, and his Embalmer's license lapsed on June 30, 2008. Mr. Giordano's New York license is currently inactive. Mr. Giordano obtained his Associate in applied Science with a major in Mortuary Science from Farmingdale State College, Farmingdale, NY on May 31, 1978. He passed National Board Examinations science and arts exams. He passed the South Carolina State Board of Funeral Service law exam on May 8, 2003.

The Board questioned Mr. Giordano regarding this matter. Mr. Giordano stated that in 2008 in order to license as a South Carolina Life and Health insurance agent he needed to relinquish his Funeral Director's license. Mr. Giordano stated that he has since discontinued his license as an insurance agent and has continued employment in the death care industry in various unlicensed positions.

### **Executive Session**

Mr. Gray made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

### **Return to Public Session**

#### **MOTION**

Mr. Baxter made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mr. Price seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

#### **MOTION**

Ms. Cooper made a motion that the Board approves Mr. Giordano's application if he completes a one year apprenticeship to include the completion of the 25 specific cases as identified on the Apprentice Quarterly Reporting Form for an apprentice funeral director and that he passes the South Carolina State Board of Funeral Service law exam. Mr. Price seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

### **B. Licensure by Endorsement/Reciprocity**

#### **1. Ramona Rena Brown**

Ms. Ramona Rena Brown appeared before the Board on her own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Ms. Brown is asking that the Board approve her Funeral Director's licensure by endorsement/reciprocity application. Ms. Brown initially licensed on October 23, 2012 as a Funeral Director in North Carolina. On July 17, 2012, Fayetteville Technical Community College, Fayetteville, North Carolina awarded Ms. Brown a Diploma in Funeral Service Education. Ms. Holleman stated that due to Ms. Brown's criminal report Board staff was unable to approve the application.

The Board questioned Ms. Brown regarding this matter.

### **Executive Session**

#### **MOTION**

Mr. Horton made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Dr. DuPre seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **Return to Public Session**

### **MOTION**

Dr. DuPre made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mr. Price seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

### **MOTION**

Ms. Cooper made a motion that the Board approves Ms. Ramona Rena Brown's Funeral Director's licensure by endorsement/reciprocity application. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **2. Tamika Patterson**

Ms. Tamika Patterson appeared before the Board on her own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Ms. Patterson is asking that the Board approve her Funeral Director and Embalmer licensure by endorsement/reciprocity application. Ms. Holleman informed the Board that Ms. Patterson initially licensed on January 31, 2018 as a Funeral Director and Embalmer in Georgia and does not have a criminal background. Ms. Holleman stated that according to the Georgia State Board of Funeral Service's Verification of Licensure form, Ms. Brown completed 3121 hours of Funeral Service apprenticeship which included 117 Funeral Directing and 110 Embalming cases. On May 2, 2017, Ogeechee Technical College, Statesboro, GA, awarded Ms. Patterson an Associate of Applied Science in Funeral Service Education.

The Board questioned Ms. Patterson regarding this matter.

## **Executive Session**

### **MOTION**

Mr. Price made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Dr. DuPre seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **Return to Public Session**

### **MOTION**

Dr. DuPre made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mr. Nelson seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

### **MOTION**

Ms. Cooper stated that although Ms. Brown does not meet the five years in Regulation 57-8(A) she has exceeded the South Carolina requirements for the completion of an apprenticeship; therefore, the motion is that the Board approves Ms. Brown's Funeral Director and Embalmer licensure by endorsement application pending passing the South Carolina State Board of Funeral Service law exam. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **3. John Travis Hill**

Mr. John Travis Hill appeared before the Board on his own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Mr. Hill is asking that the Board approve his Funeral Director and Embalmer licensure by endorsement/reciprocity application. Ms. Holleman informed the Board that Mr. Hill initially licensed on February 3, 2020 as a Funeral Director and Embalmer in North Carolina and does not have a criminal background. Ms. Holleman stated that according to the North Carolina Funeral Service Specialist Mr. Hill recorded 5074.50 Funeral Service trainee hours that which included 171 core ceremony and disposition activities, 124 funeral core arranging activities and 279 core embalming activities. On December 15, 2018, Fayetteville Technical Community College, Fayetteville, NC awarded Mr. Hill a diploma in Funeral Service Education and on December 14, 2019 awarded him an Associate of Applied Science in Funeral Service Education.

The Board questioned Mr. Hill regarding this matter.

### **Executive Session**

#### **MOTION**

Mr. Horton made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

### **Return to Public Session**

#### **MOTION**

Mr. Price made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

#### **MOTION**

Ms. Cooper made a motion that due to the Certification of Licensure from the State of North Carolina the Board finds that Mr. Hill exceeds the South Carolina requirements for licensure by endorsement; therefore, the Board approves the application pending Mr. Hill pass the South Carolina State Board of Funeral Service law exam. Mr. Price seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

The Board recessed for 10 minutes.

#### **4. Salvatore F. Spadaccino**

Mr. Salvatore F. Spadaccino appeared before the Board on his own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Mr. Spadaccino is asking that the Board approve his Funeral Director and Embalmer's licensure by endorsement/reciprocity application. Mr. Spadaccino initially licensed on March 17, 1993 as a Funeral Director and Embalmer in Connecticut. On December 18, 1991, he graduated from the American Academy McAllister Institute. Ms. Holleman stated that due to Mr. Spadaccino's criminal report Board staff was unable to approve the application.

The Board questioned Mr. Spadaccino regarding this matter.

### **Executive Session**

#### **MOTION**

Mr. Baxter made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Mr. Gray seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.



## **Return to Public Session**

### **MOTION**

Mr. Gray made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Dr. DuPre seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

### **MOTION**

Ms. Cooper made a motion that the Board approves Mr. Spadaccino's Funeral Director and Embalmer licensure by endorsement application pending that he pass the South Carolina State Board of Funeral Service law exam.

## **C. Apprenticeship Application**

### **1. Roger McFadden**

Mr. Roger McFadden appeared before the Board on his own behalf.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Mr. McFadden is asking that the Board approves his Funeral Director and Embalmer's apprenticeship application. Although statute does not address the criminal history requirement for an apprenticeship, it does require that as a consideration of licensure as a funeral director or an embalmer a person should not have been convicted of a violent crime or found guilty of a felony or crime of moral turpitude. Mr. McFadden's application is before the Board due to his criminal report.

The Board questioned Mr. McFadden regarding this matter.

## **Executive Session**

### **MOTION**

Mr. Baxter made a motion to go into executive session to receive legal advice. Mr. Gray seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## **Return to Public Session**

### **MOTION**

Mr. Gray made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickerson noted, for the record, there were no votes taken during Executive Session.

Mr. Dickerson called for a motion in this matter.

### **MOTION**

Ms. Cooper made a motion that the Advice Counsel read the motion of the Board. Dr. DuPre seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

### **MOTION**

Mr. Tennis read Ms. Cooper's motion, that the Board finds it appropriate to grant applicant's request for a Certificate of Apprenticeship and therefore grants the certificate. With respect to applicant's existing prior criminal history the Board specifically finds that, he does not appear to be unfit or unsuited to engage in the profession. However, if the applicant receives another felony or crime of moral turpitude conviction prior to obtaining a license from this Board, he must appear before the Board for a determination of his fitness to practice in the profession.

Mr. Price seconded the motion, which carried unanimously

**12. Funeral Establishment**

This proceeding was recorded by a court reporter in order to produce a verbatim transcript should one be necessary.

**A. Crematory – New Facility**

**1. Burroughs Crematory of Bennettsville, Inc. – Alan Gray Burroughs**

Mr. Alan Gray Burroughs appeared before the Board on behalf of Burroughs Crematory of Bennettsville, Inc.

Ms. Holleman informed the Board that the application is complete and that Mr. Burroughs requests that the Board approve the new crematory with him as the manager. Mr. Burroughs, license number FDE.2054, initially licensed on July 11, 1990, resides 13.7 miles from the facility, and does not have a criminal background. Ms. Holleman informed the Board that Burroughs Crematory of Bennettsville, Inc. is the owner, with Mr. Alan Gray Burroughs as the member.

The Board questioned Mr. Burroughs regarding the name of the facility.

**MOTION**

Mr. Horton made a motion that the Board approve the new crematory with Mr. Burroughs as the manager, pending passing the final inspections. Mr. Baxter seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.
