QUESTION: Is it within the role and scope of practice for the Certified Registered Nurse

Anesthetist (CRNA) and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRN) with education and preparation to insert invasive cardiovascular monitoring

lines?

The State Board of Nursing for South Carolina acknowledges that it is within the role and scope of practice for CRNAs and certain other APRNs with education and preparation to insert invasive cardiovascular monitoring lines including, but not limited to, central venous and pulmonary arterial catheters. CRNAs' and certain other APRNs' education and preparation provide the knowledge base for this skill. CRNAs and certain other APRNs are expected to have demonstrated skill competency and to have applicable written guidelines or collaborative written practice agreements in accordance with, Section 40-33-34: Performance of medical acts; qualifications; practice agreements; prescriptive authorization; anesthesia care; definitions.

This statement is an advisory opinion of the State Board of Nursing for South Carolina as to what constitutes competent and safe Advanced Practice Registered Nurse practice.
