Public notice of this meeting was properly posted at the SC Board of Physical Therapy Examiners, Synergy Business Park, Kingstree Building 110 Centerview Drive, Room 105 Columbia, SC 29211 and provided to all requesting persons, organizations, and news media in compliance with Section 30-4-80 of the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act.

Call to Order

Ms. Blackstone, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. The meeting was held in Room 105 located in the Synergy Business Park, Kingstree Building at 110 Centerview Drive, in Columbia, South Carolina 29211.

Discussion Topic:

1. Promulgate regulation to amend S.C. Code of Regs. Sec. 10-30 to establish a fee for issuing compact privileges.
2. Promulgate regulation to amend S.C. Code of Regs. Sec. 101-4 and 101-5 to require an initial applicant for licensure to undergo a state criminal record check, supported by fingerprints, by the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED) and a national criminal record check, supported by fingerprints, by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).
3. Promulgate regulation to amend S.C. Code of Regs. Sec. 101-07 to expand opportunities for licensees to obtain continuing education/competency.

4. Promulgate draft regulation S.C. Code of Regs. Sec. 101-16 to adopt rules promulgated by the Physical Therapy Compact Commission as required to implement Act No. 226 (Physical Therapy Compact Commission Rules are available for review at: <http://ptcompact.org/Portals/0/Images/PTCompactRules20180605.pdf>).


Motion: In open session, Mr. Warren made a motion to amend SC Code of Regs 10-30 to establish a \$30 fee for compact privilege which would represent 25 percent of an initial application fee to cover administrative costs in issuing compact privileges.

And then to amend Section 101-4, to add Section 6, and 101-5, to add Section 5 which would require the criminal background checks required in the Compact; to amend Section 101-07 to expand current continuing education opportunities to include methods that allow licensees to demonstrate continued professional development and competency outside the traditional CE classroom settings.


And to promulgate a regulation that would create Section 101-16 which would adopt the rules promulgated by the PT Compact Commission that are effective as of June 5, 2018. The motion was seconded and approved.
